ACLC Women In Ministry conference at Los Angeles Family Church

Christian Light MBC delivered a clear and informative presentation on the "Restoration of Marriage and Family" and the significance of the Holy Marriage Blessing Ceremony.



Following their presentation, Rev. Dr. Tanya Edwards, Senior Pastor of the New York City Family Church, conveyed a rousing, spirit-filled keynote address on the importance of parents passing on God's heart and lineage through the family. Then her husband, Bishop Jesse Edwards joined her to conduct the Holy Wine Ceremony and the Blessing of Marriage.

Upon reflection, Jennifer Pierce, an active member of the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP), said: "I was grateful to receive so much loving guidance from so many clergy who wanted to give so much love and guidance so that, as young people, we might inherit their foundation."
