Dear Friend,

Freedom of expression, enshrined in Article 19 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, is a cornerstone of democracy. Yet press freedom must be balanced with responsibility. When media outlets stigmatize religious minorities, they distort reality, undermine trust, and endanger the democratic freedoms peacebuilders seek to protect.

Across Europe and beyond, terms such as "sect" or "cult" - without legal or academic basis - have been used to delegitimize entire faith communities. This language fuels prejudice, exclusion, and even violence. From Hare Krishna devotees attacked in Germany, to Jehovah's Witnesses banned in Russia, to Christians under-reported in Nigeria, the consequences are severe.

In Japan, media-fuelled hysteria following the assassination of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe triggered a government move to dissolve the Japanese Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (FFWPU - formerly the Unification Church), condemned globally as a violation of democratic and human rights.

A very troubling example comes from South Korea, where 82-year-old Dr Hak Ja Han Moon, co-founder of the Universal Peace Federation (UPF) and FFWPU, has been held in pre-trial detention despite recent heart surgery. Her case follows hostile media stories that cast suspicion on her faith community rather than report facts fairly.

These patterns show how media bias accelerates persecution: through silence, distortion, or smear campaigns, irresponsible reporting emboldens hate, legitimizes repression, and erodes democratic freedoms.




