During the 7 day Divine Principle seminar, you will have the opportunity to delve more deeply into the teachings of the Reverend Sun Myung Moon and begin to understand the spiritual vision which underlies so many of the projects which he has initiated or inspired. The Location



Cleeve House

A beautiful country house set in the midst of green pastures, Cleeve House is an ideal location to spend time studying and sharing while enjoying the lush Wiltshire countryside. During this programme, accommodation will vary from, shared two and three person bedrooms in the main building, to tents beneath an enclosed marquee on the back lawn. Prices vary according to the level of accommodation (see below). You will enjoy tasty home cooking in a friendly environment surrounded by participants from throughout Europe.

Workshop Fee

€320 (£270) - accommodation in Cleeve House sharing a room with two or three beds

€180 (£150) – accommodation in your tent with a sleeping bag (both of which you bring) under the marquee on the back lawn. These fees include accommodation and all meals, from dinner on the arrival day to lunch on the departure day. Additional meals or nights will require further payment – please consult us about specific charges and availability.

(Please pay by cash on arrival or by advance payment to the European Office)

Transportation

The closest airport to Cleeve House is Bristol International (one hour drive). This airport is well served by the budget airlines *EasyJet* and *Ryanair* as well as other major airlines and is strongly recommended as the most convenient point of entry. If you must use a London airport, please use Heathrow Airport only. Upon arrival at Heathrow, make your way to the airport coach station near Terminals 1, 2 and 3. Buy a return ticket on the National Express coach to the town of Chippenham; a 2 hour journey (cost €37 (£30)). There will be an additional charge of £8/10 € for pick-up and drop off from Bristol airport and a £5/6 € charge for those using Chippenham coach station. For those coming by car, the address is above.

Arrival and Departure Times

The workshop will begin with an evening meal from 7pm on Thursday 21st June and will end after a light lunch and graduation ceremony on Wednesday 27th June at approximately 2pm. Please use this information for planning your journeys to and from Cleeve House. To allow enough time to reach Cleeve House, your flight to Heathrow airport should arrive no later than 3pm, and your flight to Bristol should arrive no later than 5pm. For those departing through Heathrow airport, your flight should leave no earlier than 5pm and for those leaving through Bristol airport, your flight should leave no earlier than 4pm.

To apply you will need to complete the registration form. Please send it to euhq@ffwpu-eu.org. You are encouraged to register your intention to attend the workshop as soon as possible. Please also send your full travel information as soon as it is confirmed.


The programme

Each day will begin with some optional light exercise and a time of devotion, study and prayer, drawing on a wide variety of religious texts and inspirational sources. There will be four presentations a day with time for questions and answers or group discussion at the end of the morning and afternoon sessions. There will be time for recreation or rest after lunch each day, and a variety of evening programmes: a film night, a prayer evening, a testimony evening and evenings of games and home-grown entertainment.

The Workshop Ethos

Many find the Workshop to be a most surprising and valuable form of religious retreat. You can take time away from the pressures of day-to-day life and reflect more on the inner life in the company of others. Participants are encouraged to embrace the schedule and treat each other as brothers and sisters – ‘One Family Under God’. We like to think of it as a journey we make together, and each participant adds something significant to the whole experience.
