

Set Free

74 campers and 22 staff from multiple states returned to Camp Aurora's longtime home, Geneva Point Center, on beautiful Lake Winnipesaukee, New Hampshire for a fun filled week to rekindle friendships, build our amazing community, discover more about their personal value, and go deeper with God. This year's theme was **Set Free**. Campers asked important questions and set about releasing themselves from limitations they place upon themselves, to discover their unique potential as a child of God.

In the months leading up to camp, staff met via zoom weekly to plan the theme, educational content, and activities. We are incredibly grateful to the entire staff for their investment and long-term commitment to this important youth ministry.

Learning together

Through discussion and drawing on inspiration from our Heavenly Parent and True Parents we invested in building a community where participants felt safe to be themselves and share openly about the questions they have as they develop an authentic faith.

We explored what it looks like to set ourselves free of self-judgment and all the things that hold us back from fulfilling our potential. We encouraged campers to set themselves free during the week by trying new things, making new friends, and set themselves a goal to do it!

In high school camp, directors focused on speaking about our relationship with God and asking questions such as: do you feel God? Which relationships do you feel God in the most? The high schoolers had deep and introspective answers, sharing where they felt God the most and where they wanted to create more space for God in their lives.

Each day emphasized a different aspect of the theme Set Free. We communicated through morning services, age appropriate, interactive morning educational sessions, team building



activities, and camp theater. The camp theater built younger campers' understanding of the theme. Youth Camp prepared a skit about Moses who set his people free! A number of the children didn't know who Moses was, so this was an ideal way for them to gain an understanding of an important champion for God.

One Middle School skit explored the early church and True Father's efforts to share the message of the Divine Principle to set people free. It was great to get youth to engage with

what life was like in the Unification Church of the 50s and 60s. The costumes were incredibly creative and brought the skits alive!

Older campers asked important questions about their faith, our teachings and lifestyle through Q&A sessions and discussion groups. Directors and group leaders invested in preparing interesting and practical presentations to help campers understand how the Divine Principle is applied in real life.

Campers wrote reflections about their experience. The following statements reflect multiple very similar answers. Responses are too numerous to detail!

"I learned that living for the sake of others also means living for yourself and making sure you have space and not burning out." This is key to a healthy life of faith. Campers learned that it's important to have ways to replenish yourself. Our power to keep loving and giving comes from our connection to God's love.

Another camper shared, "We don't need to care about the negative things people say about you." We explored how connecting to your essential eternal value rather than relying on the perspectives of others is critical to healthy self-esteem and emotional stability that all feed into a balanced life of faith.

One camper wrote, "My favorite talks were about how True Parents always love us."

"I loved the Q&A."

"All the content for High School because it made me think more about community."


"I love learning about Spiritual Styles – I discovered I feel God through nature and contemplation, which I had never thought about before."

"I got so much out of the Boys Night talk."

"Learning about True Father's life. Father said, 'I have no enemies'. That really made me think"

Experiencing genuine relationships in community

The ties that bind us run deep, and Camp Aurora is one of the spaces that foster development of relationships that keep us connected as a Unificationist community. An important part of Camp Aurora is buddies! We pair high schoolers with middle and elementary school campers so that older campers can experience caring for and being a role model

for younger campers and younger campers can experience the care and love of an older brother or sister. While the buddy "system" is intentional, the relationships and joy that occur is spontaneous, and shows up in beautiful and unexpected interactions during camp and in the subsequent school year. This allows our campers to practice the Divine Principle in daily life.

Having fun together

Camp activities included Song Fest, sports, arts and crafts, kayaking and fun at the beach. Making bracelets is always a hit regardless of age and gender! Special thanks to our energetic sports coordinators who organized the games and activities, including the popular and creative

game, Gladiators. John, a new member of our UC community, and Patrick spared no effort in creating camp wide activities, slip and slides, and games too numerous to mention. Our Activities Coordinators were on the go 24/7!

Camp Aurora Idol showcased the incredible talent in our community from music to stand-up comedy, martial arts displays and the incredible juggling, light display from a talented High Schooler.
