Dr. Hak Ja Han Moon and the late Rev. Dr. Sun Myung Moon have overcome countless obstacles along the way of leaving behind a legacy of love, as expressed in the paragraph below, an excerpt from one of Dr. Han's public speeches.

Dr. Han has said that her life "resembles the ocean. The ocean is wide enough to embrace the sky, and seems to become one with the sky when reflecting its light. It is the lowest place that receives water from all over the world. The ocean embraces everything and begets all life. The ocean appears to be calm and tranquil, but massive black currents flow and rush thousands of meters deep below the surface. When the raging waves and tsunamis rise, everything becomes swallowed up at once. People cannot see the whirlpools that swirl deep within the sea. This is the way my life has unfolded. Within the providence that rages around me like a typhoon, there have been many unspeakable stories unknown to anyone but me. I have struggled against that whirlpool and brought victory without being swept away. This is how I was able to achieve so much for world peace together with my husband."

Good News for Religious Freedom in Japan!

In 2010 and 2011 WFWP USA was involved intensely in raising awareness of faith-breaking issues in Japan. Members of WFWP who were also members of the Unification Church had been discriminated against for their faith, and had been detained against their will in secluded apartments for weeks and months and sometimes for years. In the case of women, many were also sexually abused, emotionally abused, and disrespected. Altogether 80 percent of the more than 4,300 Unification Church members who were kidnapped in Japan since 1966 were women.

One of the most extreme cases was that of a young man, Mr. Toru Goto, who has now finally been vindicated.

Mr. Goto, a Unification Church member, was forcibly kidnapped in September 1995 by three of his family members and two professional deprogrammers, Takashi Miyamura and Yasutomo Matsunaga, and held for 12 years and 5 months in an unsuccessful attempt to break his faith. He was finally thrown out onto a street in February 2008. He was invited by WFWP to speak at the 2010 WFWP National Assembly in New York, where he addressed human rights and religious freedom issues.

Finally, on January 28, 2014, a Japanese court ruled in favor of Mr. Goto's sixth deposition filed in a civil suit against his captors and deprogrammers. He sued three members of his family and two deprogrammers and was awarded an amount equivalent to about \$47,000. At a press conference after the verdict, Mr. Goto said, "I am pleased by the single point that the culpability of deprogrammer Takashi Miyamura has been recognized."

Unfortunately, the outcome is bittersweet because already in January 2014 there have been two more known cases of religious kidnapping in Japan.

Honoring Martin Luther King in Song

Donations needed include staple items such as:

- Toothbrushes

Things needed for the educational seminars include:

- Looseleaf notebook paper
- Pens
- Crayons for small children
- Construction paper
- Bottled water for participants
- Meals for 1,000 participants
- Styrofoam plates and cups
- Plastic forks, spoons, and knives
- Napkins and toilet paper
- Refreshments

Medical supplies are also needed (more information on this in future newsletters). Personnel needed include midwives and those trained in the Lamaze technique.

Commission on the Status Of Women (CSW) 58

The CSW's 58th session opens Monday, March 10, and ends Friday, March 21. For the past 10 years, the WFP UN Office has hosted a parallel event during the CSW session. This year, the parallel event will be on **Tuesday, March 18, from 2:30-4:00 p.m.**, in the UN Church Center, Hardin Room, across the street from the UN Headquarters. The CSW 58 priority theme is "Challenges and achievements in the implementation of the Millennium Development Goals for women and girls." The theme for the WFP event is "Stories of Women's Leadership: Achievements and Challenges toward achieving the post 2015 agenda goals." Everyone is invited to attend this parallel event. Attendance at this event does not require either a CSW pass or a UN grounds pass.

According to Mrs. Alexa Ward, deputy director of the WFP UN Office, "WFP is organizing a panel around this theme. At this time the panel includes Dr. Arceli Hernando, vice president of Bohol Island University, the Philippines; Dr. Lan Young Moon, president of WFP International; and Mrs. Sachiko Kimura, project director and overseas volunteer for Zambia, WFP Japan. The panel will include four speakers."
