World Mission HQ Director General Song Yong-cheon's Latin America Tour

Prior to the Heavenly Latin America Special Assembly, Song Yong-cheon, Director General of World Mission Headquarters, received a special mission from True Mother to tour four countries in Heavenly Latin America where True Parents have walked the providential path, to establish a foundation of devotion. From June 24th to July 3rd, Song Yong-cheon (hereafter Rev. Song), along with Matsuda Koji (World President of CARP), Imai (Vice President), and Motoyama (Deputy Director of Missionary Support), embarked on a tour of four countries - Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay, and Brazil. These are places where True Parents have invested their hearts to address issues such as food security and climate change for Heavenly Unified Korea and Heavenly Unified World.



First, upon arriving in Buenos Aires, Argentina, the group visited the headquarters church and offered a Cheonshim Won prayer. They then visited Corrientes, Paso de la Patria, and Cabana Don Julian Hotel in Argentina, where True Parents had visited 16 times over a year and a half from May 23, 1995, to address humanity's food and climate issues for a unified Korea and world.

After assessing the local situation in Argentina, Rev. Song received reports on practical church growth, national restoration environment, youth activities, and land management plans. He then shared True Mother's vision for Vision 2025, the Cheon Won Gung Cheon Il Sanctum dedication ceremony, and the construction of the World Peace Highway, offering hope for Argentina's future.

Second, the group moved to Uruguay, where they visited the 'National Garden', which is currently the FFWPU Uruguay headquarters building and was inaugurated by True Parents in 2001 as the UPF headquarters and Peace Embassy. Rev. Song presided over a leaders' meeting there. They also visited the CARP center, where he expounded on True Mother's vision for youth witnessing activities. In the evening, through special gatherings with Uruguayan members and visits to local churches, he shared the providential significance of True Mother's recent 'Cheon Mu Won announcement' and the '2025 Cheon Won Gung Cheon Il Sanctum Dedication Ceremony', dedicating himself to spreading True Mother's love throughout Uruguay.







Third, upon arriving in Paraguay, Rev. Song visited the association headquarters and held a leaders' meeting. He conveyed True Mother's earnest heart not to miss the providence that True Father had walked, and emphasized the importance of the upcoming Heavenly Latin America Special Assembly with True Mother.





He urged the members to unite with True Parents and strive for victory, especially considering True Mother had to announce the Cheon Mu Won just 10 months before the Cheon Won Gung Cheon Il Sanctum dedication ceremony. Moreover, through visits to the maritime providence shipyard 'Aqua Mundo' and Leda, Rev. Song assessed how True Parents' providential sites are being preserved and maintained. He stressed the urgent need for leaders to devise concrete plans through wisdom and strategy to realize True Parents' will.

Lastly, upon arriving in Brazil, Rev. Song visited the Brazilian church and five churches in São Paulo to check if practical church growth was being achieved in alignment with True Mother's words. He assessed the current status of church management, witnessing, youth culture establishment, and CheonBo family operations.









Rev. Song concluded that while Brazil's passion for the CheonBo providence, sense of mission for witnessing, and youth community culture have become the foundation for practical church growth, measures are needed to reduce the gap between regional and local churches.

After completing the tour, Rev. Song shared his impressions of the four-country tour in South America, saying, "Even before visiting the field directly, I could feel that True Mother had meticulously checked and prepared every small church. I want to sincerely thank True Mother for sending amazing grace and miracles."
