

Korean Religious Council's Interfaith Prayer Meeting at Cheon Il Guk Embassy, UN Village, Hannam-dong, South Korea

An interfaith prayer meeting, organized by the Korean Religious Council, was held at the Cheon Il Guk Embassy in the UN Village of Hannam-dong, Yongsan on August 14. The event brought together religious leaders to unite their hearts and sincerity in pursuit of peace on the Korean Peninsula and the realization of Heavenly Unified Korea.

Lee Hyun-young, Director of the Cheon Il Guk Embassy and President of the Korean Religious Council, remarked, "After True Mother Han Hak-ja Moon transformed the Hannam-dong International Training Center into the Cheon Il Guk Embassy and appointed Hwang Bo-guk as the director, this place became incredibly vibrant." He continued, "Just as good minerals are polished and processed to make jewels, I will do my best as the successor director to make this a representative embassy of Cheon Il Guk, building upon the foundation that has been laid." Lee then shared his impressions and future plans.

Lee further noted, "Unlike politicians and economists, the Religious Council plays an important role in creating a wide platform where many people can gather." He emphasized, "Let's all unite and move forward for Heavenly Unified Korea with the historic mission of achieving unification on the Korean Peninsula."

Hwang Bo-guk, President of FFWPU-Korea and former Director of the Cheon Il Guk Embassy, offered encouragement by referencing a Bible passage: "In Jeremiah 29:10, when the people of Israel lost their temple and were wandering, God sent Jeremiah to comfort them and promise that they would regain the temple." He added, "Because True Mother has promised us Heavenly Unified Korea amidst the pain of division and various difficulties, we should have hope for unification and religions should take the lead in achieving peaceful unification."

The religious leaders concluded the prayer meeting by singing "Our Cherished Hopes are for Unity," expressing their wish for the Cheon Il Guk Embassy to become a place that establishes the right standards for politics and religion, while praying for the unification of North and South Korea.
