Future Generation Young Women Full-time Members Workshop in Jeju

From September 10-12, 2024, Jeju Island hosted a transformative event: the Future Generation Young Women Full-time Members Workshop. Fifty dedicated women under 40, all full-time members of the organization, converged at the Jeju Main Church and surrounding holy grounds for three days of learning, reflection, and bonding.

The workshop's primary aim was to strengthen these young leaders' connection with True Parents and prepare them for the advancing towards VISION 2025 initiative. Through a carefully curated program, participants engaged in team-building activities, discussions, and spiritual reflections.



Day one focused on fostering communication and cooperation among the attendees. Song Hwa Jin, Secretary General of the Women's Federation, led an insightful discussion session. She encouraged the women to recognize divine works in their lives and contribute to the providence through personal growth. She also shared the Women's Federation's vision, emphasizing the crucial role these young leaders play in fulfilling the organization's goals.



The second day was dedicated to deepening the participants' understanding of True Parents' legacy. Shin Myung-soo, pastor of Seogwipo Church, guided the group through Jeju's holy sites, offering a vivid narrative of the island's providential history. Highlights included visits to True Mother's childhood elementary school in Hyodon and the Seogwipo official residence, where True Parents once stayed with their children. Mr. Shin conveyed True Parents' hope for Jeju to become a global center where women could work towards realizing Heavenly Parent's dream.



Later that day, Professor Kim Min-ji from Sun Moon University's Theology Department led a discussion on the long-term journey of being a female full-time member. She encouraged the women to envision and actively shape their paths with pride, stressing the importance of growing together as comrades united in heart and purpose.

On the final day, participants grouped by district to set concrete goals. These ranged from youth outreach and single blessings to reactivating inactive members and fostering connections with Christian communities. All these efforts are aimed at ensuring a victorious entry into the Cheon II Sanctum in Cheon Won Gung in 2025.

As the workshop concluded, these young women leaders left Jeju Island with a renewed sense of purpose and a commitment to bear fruit in their respective roles.
