It will be the greatest holy ground, which we will remember throughout our lives.

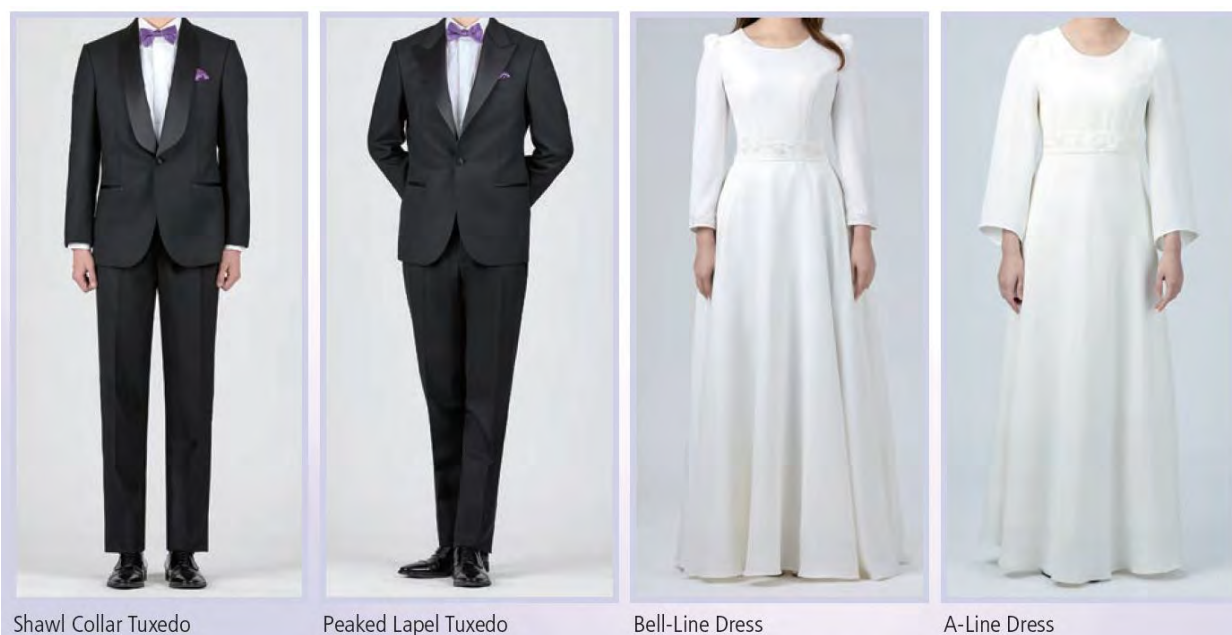

Cheon II Guk Ceremonial Attire:

Men's Tuxedo / Women's Dress



Family Federation ceremonial attire has been worn at all major ceremonies, including the 8 major holy days, Seong-il, 3-day ceremonies, child dedications, Seonghwa ceremonies, and Blessing ceremonies. It symbolizes the identity and orthodoxy of the Family Federation and respect for Heavenly Parent.

True Mother instructed Kristina Han to prepare for the Entrance into the Cheon II Sanctum in Cheon Won Gung, establishing traditions for ceremonial attire and gifts befitting Cheon II Guk citizens.

Cheon II Guk Ceremonial Attire

Cheon II Guk ceremonial attire is divided into tuxedos for men and dresses for women. True Mother designed the ceremonial attire with purple, symbolizing Cheon II Guk, and daffodils as motifs.

The men's ceremonial attire basically consists of a jacket, pants, shirt, bow tie, and handkerchief. True Mother determined all the details, including the fabric, shirt, and buttons.

The ceremonial attire has a common style without distinguishing between married and unmarried individuals. The suit lapel shapes are divided into peaked and shawl collars. The purple bow tie and handkerchief were made to create a sophisticated appearance for the Cheon Il Guk ceremonial attire.

The women's ceremonial attire consists of a classic dress and a purple amethyst gift set. True Mother provided detailed guidance on everything from the dress fabric to the length, proportions, and shape.

The dress is made in white, symbolizing joy, glory, purity, and peace. Considering a form that can be worn sacredly worldwide, daffodil lace was added to create a sophisticated and luxurious feel.

Symbolism of Cheon Il Guk Gifts

The Cheon Il Guk gift ring has purple amethyst as its motif, symbolizing royal authority, glory, and nobility. The ring signifies the realization of the ideal blessed family.

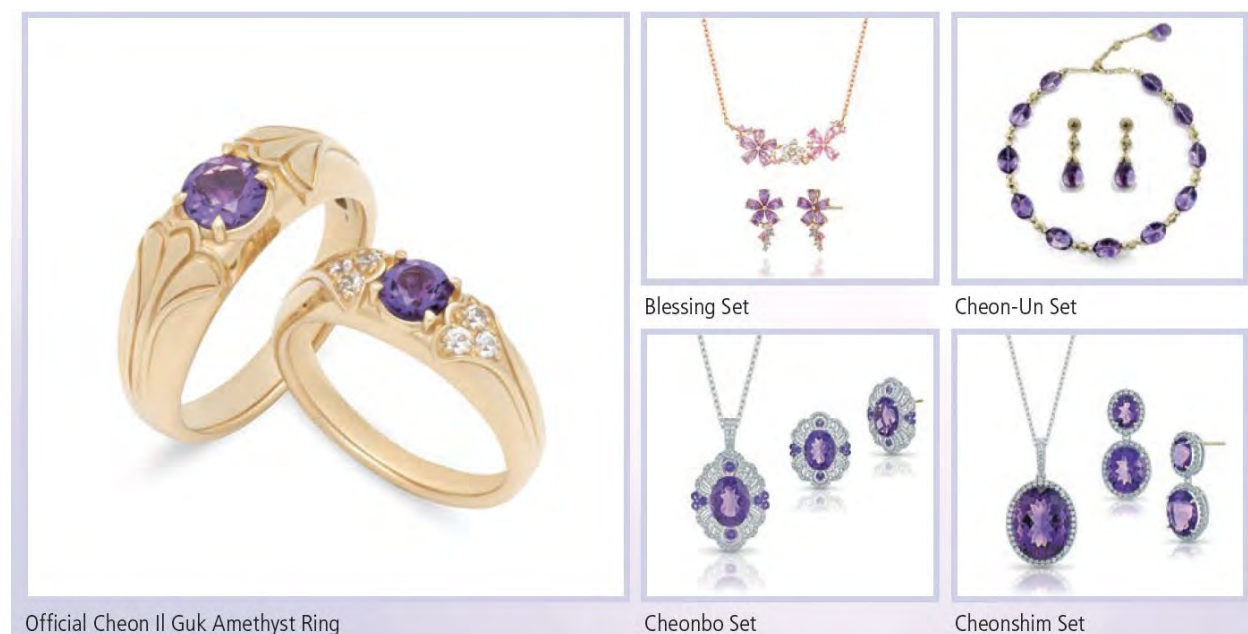
The gift set consists of a necklace and earrings made with purple amethyst, and it was produced in three different designs: the CheonBo set, the Cheon-Un set, and the Cheonshim set.
