

Archbishop George Augustus Stallings' Blessing Ceremony in Richmond, VA

A Holy Wine Ceremony and Blessing Ceremony were held on Sunday, May 6, after regular weekly Sunday 10:30 am Temple Mass at the African American Catholic Congregation (AACC) Imani Temple of the Capital Region, 2420 Brooks Drive Suitland MD 20746.

Presided over and officiated by AACC founder and ACLC Co-Chairman, Archbishop George Augustus Stallings Jr., it was a liberating and empowering ceremony that saw 17 representative couples stand and receive the Marriage Blessing.



This Blessing Ceremony was very special to the Imani Temple family and church community as a whole, as it was held on a day designated as 'Black Marriage Day' and on the heels of, and the culmination of, the Imani Temple's men's retreat held that weekend from Friday evening to Sunday morning.

Among the 17 representative couples who rededicated their marriages, was couple of 60 years of marriage, Mr. Ernest and Mrs. Delores Kelly, (pictured below with Rev. Bayo's couple). Mrs. Kelly serves as a Minister of Hospitality at Imani Temple. The Kellys' participation was a great blessing to all, for they truly stood as an example of what our Heavenly Parent would love for all couples to inherit: the faithfulness before God and the community to keep our true love marriage vows.

Several participants stood with photographs of their spouses due to temporary separation for school, work and those who had transitioned to the spirit world.
