Gladys Amelivia Starr is the wife of Gilbert Starr. Gladys was born on May 17, 1952 to her parents, Jose Felix Arzu and Zoila Rodriquez. Gladys lived her life for God and humanity. She is a woman with a deep heart of love, and a woman of great virtue. She took pride in the fact that she received the Blessing of God and True Parents as a virgin. Gladys was always obedient to God, True Parents and her parents. She truly lived her life in service to others. She served and loved others joyfully. Gladys came to the United States, from LaCeiba, Honduras, C.A. in 1975. She came with the desire to study English and to pursue a career as an executive secretary.

She met the Unification Church in 1978, and joined immediately. She received a 2-Day and 7-Day workshop.
