

Born into a family of Doctors, Olga has studied General Medicine, Dermatology and Venerial Diseases in the Ukraine and USA. From 2004 to 2005, Olga was the personal doctor to the Ukrainian President. In 2009 she organised the All-Ukrainian Charitable Health Marathon in which 61,553 Ukrainian orphans were examined. Since 2009 Olga Bogomolets is the organiser and coordinator of the International Annual Charitable Campaign of the European Academy of Dermatology in the Ukraine, and continues to be the Head Physician at Dr. Olga Bogomolets Institute of Dermatology and Cosmetology.



Founder and President of NGO, Lebanese Women Towards Decision Making, Kholoud is active in integrating women into the political sphere in Lebanon. She was the MENA coordinator of Women in parliament from 2014-2016, as well as the Senior adviser of Women Political Leaders, Kholoud was a candidate to the Lebanese parliament between 2013 and 2018, and is a member of the Vital Voices Cohort.

Mimosa Kusari-Lila



Mimoza Kusari-Lila, is a Chairwoman in the political party for Kosovo Alternativa. She is a member of the Kosovo Parliament for the second consecutive term, and the first and only woman mayor (of Gjakova) ever to be elected in Kosovo. Prior to being mayor, Mimoza served as a Deputy PM and Minister of Trade and Industry. During her term as a Kosovo MP, Mimoza initiated and established the Green Caucus of the Kosova Parliament, while serving at the Economic Development Committee.

Mimoza was introduced to politics in 2003 when she was appointed Spokesperson and advisor to the first Prime Minister of Kosovo after the war.



Rebekah Warren



Having served as a member of the Michigan House of Representatives and the Michigan Senate since 2006, Rebekah Warren has more years of experience as a legislator than any other current member of her state legislature. She is now the State Representative for the 55th District and the Democratic Vice Chair of the House Ways and Means Committee, a role that has been described as "the chief policy negotiator for the House Democrats." A selection of her legislative accomplishments includes a landmark water protection policy, a requirement that health insurance cover autism spectrum disorders, and protecting a woman's right to breastfeed her child anywhere that she is legally allowed to be. Prior to her work as a lawmaker, Rebekah spent seven years as the executive director of what was then the state's oldest and largest women's health care nonprofit organisation.



Carolyn Handschin-Moser



Currently the Vice President of the NGO Committee on the Status of Women at the United Nations in Geneva, Carolyn is also Vice-President of Women's Federation for World Peace International. She is the Director of the WFWPI Office for United Nations Relations globally and has led their advocacy team at the UN in Geneva for 22 years, focusing on education, peace and human rights through the empowerment of women and girls, protection of the family and women in community and nation building. Her concern for youth led her to create the WFWPI-UN Internship Program in Geneva and co-found the Model UN Inter-religious Youth Program,
