We learned that he was fasting so often, that one day he collapsed, becoming unconscious for 2 days and was saved only by the prayers of True Father and the entire Korean Church.

He was a man who was completely led spiritually through his deep relationship with God, and had miraculous experiences with Joan of Arc speaking directly to him from the pulpit of her church in Paris,

and many others in the spiritual world that guided him as well. From him, our French family learned discipline, unwavering faith, and to develop long suffering endurance while going forward.

His leadership style was imposing and direct and exactly what was needed to break through. Through the unity of his first members, especially Henri Blanchard, they could create miracles like bringing over 100 new members in one year that accompanied him and Barbara to their next mission in the United States.

Spiritually he is the father of France, greater than any French saint. He and his devoted wife battled Communism, Atheism, and Socialism and brought spiritual life to a country, that did everything in its power to deny the existence of God. Rev. He never stopped praying for, loving and supporting our country in spite of his work in America, and for that we are eternally grateful.

As France is in a grave crisis now, he will be of great assistance from Heaven.

As he "marches on" in the next life at the side of True Father, our hearts and prayers go with him and his family.
