Climate Action

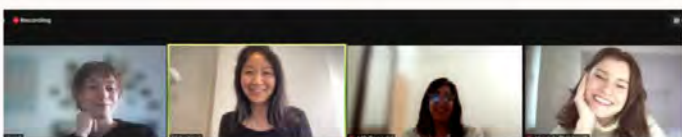
