CIG - Fall Mission Prep

The CIG youth missionaries immersed themselves in the national witnessing campaign, joining in the first wave of 21 days with the Bay Area community! To prepare, they not only received internal guidance on how to witness and the mindset to have, but also disciplined themselves with a strict schedule and a clear standard of what it means to be a missionary.



At Chabot College and California State University, East Bay (CSUEB), they approached many students and invited them to a CARP club meeting. 12 students attend the weekly Chabot club meeting and 9 students attended a Peace Starts With Me (PSWM) meet-up at CSUEB, fully organized and ran by the CIGs. One of their guests also joined the Friday evening PSWM program the following day.



On Saturday, they collaborated with councilman Noel Gallo and the City of Oakland for a trash clean-up project in the Fruitvale neighborhood of Oakland. This was followed by a PSWM seminar at the Bay Area Family Church.





The Mission Kick-off workshop concluded with their pledge ceremony, where the missionaries declared their goals of how they will impact America through the number of people they would like to testify to about True Mother. Now, there are five teams going out to five communities: New Jersey, Georgia, Indiana, Bay Area, and Los Angeles. For the next two months, the teams will be fully engaged and active in supporting their local witnessing efforts.


We further learn that God saved this nation for a specific purpose and reason for us to be the nation in which God could revive the world.
