

The talk from Vision Night was given by Yuta Horii, where he shared about mutual righteousness. He expressed that to uplift others, you can't just be nice, or strict. Rather, you must have both gentle care and tough love to truly uplift others.

Here is a testimony from Josef, regarding his experience in bringing one of his guests to an Essence of Truth workshop, where they go over the principles of creation, the essence of Jesus, and the Only Begotten Daughter in two lectures.

"This week I was excited to bring my guest Stephan to Essence of Truth to learn about the Essence of Jesus and True Parents. On Friday evening in the Cheongshim Won prayer vigil, I chanted his name 1,000 times to offer jeong seong to mobilize Spirit World. Stephan agreed to come 3 days before the event. But 6 hours before the event he texts me he can't make it because he is tired due to his busy schedule. I felt down and knew something was wrong spiritually. Then, three different people texted me about Stephan, and I felt it was a sign to not give up on Stephan and call him. Right about when I go to call him, he calls me and says he changed his mind and will come. He had an amazing experience as he was the only guest. I found out he had a dream, which led him to change his mind. We are currently going to read about Christology as we move forward in his education. I am excited to witness to Stephan and myself. I know True Parents is will solve all problems when we unite one in heart."

Georgia


Here is a testimony from one of our 2nd year CIG missionaries, Sunjo Braganza:

God gives me what I can handle

"It was during the sixth week of my mission in Georgia that I finally had my first guest come to an event. It was an on-campus event called "Peace Hangout." My first guest, "Kaelin" was someone I talked to during my first day witnessing on-campus and it was six weeks later that he finally came to an event. He had a personality that was challenging for me in the way that he joked in a way during the event that I thought was disruptive to the atmosphere from my perspective.

Asking God in prayer about it, the answer I got was that I had to grow my genuine curiosity and ability to "talk to people" to a level that I was ready to receive him. I grew these skills by working on it through the team, community & other guests; taking initiative to talk and get to know them though it was out of my comfort zone. Learning to be more vocal about my feelings and opinions helped prepare me for guests who have "opposing" thoughts or personalities to me. I can overcome this by discussing with my team. This experience helps me to know that God is intentionally putting people or situations in place for me to cater to my own journey."
