The hour has come. The CIGs have concluded their mission in their target

communities, saying their farewells. In typical GPA fashion, their last week was the busiest week and the CIGs in LA were bustling with activity as they made the final offering to God and the LA community.

These past couple of weeks, the CIGs have been working on taking ownership, supporting different events and activities. Although they supported many other events, this was their first time being the main organizers of one of them—a one-day workshop hosted at the Pasadena House, a church center that has been used for decades by the community.

They planned everything; from who would prepare meals, the activities they would play, and the lecturers who would be speaking. It was challenging, but it left them with a sense of accomplishment. Approximately 15 people came and received content about the Only Begotten Daughter, the Principle of Creation and the Essence of Jesus. The workshop ended with a sleepover at the Pasadena House, and everyone attending Sunday service the next day.



The last Vision Night they helped plan was a resounding success, with many guests and members coming to hear the message. One of the CIG members, Nana, gave a talk on Education of Heart. It was a powerful message, and someone even testified that they felt God speaking through her. The CIGs felt the impact they were able to make on the attendees, as their faces were visibly brighter as they left the event.

Their time in LA concluded by giving a report about their mission in front of the entire congregation. They gave a brief overview of all of their events that they participated in over the past two months, and ended off with a testimony given by Will Smith. Looking back on their time in LA, the impact that they made in the community is undeniable. There were many things that were made possible because of the CIGs. The presentation showed off the fruits of their labor and the genuine effort that they made while on mission.

"I learned that I am blessed. The Google definition of blessing is "a favor given to us by God", and I learned that this is so true. I, and everyone else here is blessed. What we have in this movement is so special. We can go across this whole country and wherever we go, we have people we can call family. Even if we go overseas, like Korea, we can still find people we call family. And it's our duty to spread these blessings. Of course, in this time as CIG missionaries our mission is to spread this love that True Parents gave us. But our mission shouldn't end here, we're lifetime missionaries. And even if we don't spread the truth, we can spread love. Not just through Principle, but primarily through love. And that's how we can move people's hearts."

Although Will was the one who gave the representative testimony for service, everything he said strikes true for the CIG missionaries. Witnessing is simply about how much love we can give to the people; bringing God's children back to his family.

We are life-long missionaries. Our mission doesn't end here even when they leave LA, but their mission continues even as they go out into a fundraising condition. Their mission and duty is to spread the love of True Parents wherever they are, whatever they are doing.

Despite where they came from, even if they were enemy countries, even if they didn't agree on everything, I could see that each one of them loved the same God that I did, and so that was really inspiring."



After spending 58 days in Little Rock, we felt very sentimental in having to move on. The last couple weeks, we've been preparing to leave Little Rock. The Little Rock Family Church members prepared a "Thank You" dinner for us, during which we shared our testimonies about our time there. Much gratitude was shared on both sides. We received so much love from the community while being here, our aunts and uncles took very good care of us. With their foundation, HUSA was able to help bring more people into this Heavenly family.

We hope the seed that we planted there will continue to grow and flourish—even if we're not there physically, our hearts will be!
