Welfare Reform: Where Do We Go from Here?

Lawrence Mead was the principal theorist behind the landmark welfare reform legislation of 1996 that was negotiated between Newt Gingrich and President Bill Clinton. It has been recognized as the most radical change in American social policy since civil rights. For the first time, the nation seriously required that most single parents on cash welfare should have to work as a condition of aid. The act drove around two-thirds of welfare adults off the rolls, mostly into jobs. Incomes rose and poverty declined, discrediting the views of many critics. It emphasized the importance of family stability and encouraged the formation and maintenance of two-parent families.

Professor Mead argues that the welfare problem remains a serious issue today, due primarily to rapid immigration from non-western countries which lack America's individualistic culture where prospering in a free but

competitive society is difficult. He offers both a sober analysis and a hopeful way forward to maintain the dynamism of American culture and economy.
