

A Truly Sacrificial Life: Masaki Sasamoto



Masaki Sasamoto (1950–1981) was a martyr who lost his life in Tanzania. As a young man in Japan, he was intensely searching for truth. He studied philosophy at Housei University, and before encountering the Divine Principle, he had studied the Mormon and Jehovah's Witness teachings.

Mr. Sasamoto had artistic talent in sculpture and painting. He enjoyed hiking in the mountains. Once he climbed a mountain during winter and lost his way. In that life-threatening situation, he dug a hole in the snow and waited, expecting death to come, but rescuers found him instead.

Soon after that, he met the Unification Church and joined the Nagano Church in Tokyo on April 10, 1973. As a typical member, he sold flowers and for a time sold ginseng.

He and his wife Chieko were blessed among the 1,800-couple blessing group in Seoul on February 8, 1975, after which he was assigned as a missionary to Malawi. In a testimony he submitted

after having completed three years as a missionary, he wrote, "Upon receiving the assignment as missionary to Malawi, I was puzzled at such an enormous blessing and could not believe that it was real.... "But considering True Parents deep love, I determined to sacrifice myself under any miserable situation, again and again. I left Japan on May 24, 1975, with a stalwart heart, thinking about how to actualize the heart of love and compassion and to meet God and True Parents expectations in Malawi."

He struggled in Malawi, being unable to communicate well with his fellow missionaries and with the local people. Mr. Sasamoto respected Malawians. The established churches, however, and the police persecuted missionaries.



He was known for his prayer life. At times, he would go to a nearby mountain to pray from dawn until midnight. On September 5, 1975, when the police took his fellow missionaries to the police station, Mr. Sasamoto eluded them and went to a mountain to pray. Later, he, too, was arrested and spent three days in jail. He understood that the police had shut down their mission work and he couldn't continue there. Upon his release from jail, he traveled to Zambia to join the missionaries

there. He used his painting skills to create scenes of daily life, which Zambians enjoy and thereby connected with the Zambian people.

During a December 1979 missionary conference in Kenya, Mr. Sasamoto asked if he could transfer to Tanzania. His request was granted. He arrived on July 6, 1980 in Tanzania, a country which had imprisoned the original three missionaries and then deported them. In an effort to make a new start, Mr. Sasamoto climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest mountain. He was then the only missionary in Tanzania. He was struggling to generate funds, witness and renew his visa, but he persisted. A week before his wife was planning to join him in his mission, inexplicably, his life ended. On December 18, in a confrontation in his home with the police, who were perhaps looking for illegal residents, Masaki Sasamoto was shot twice and died. His body was discovered the following morning.

Three days later, his wife arrived. She identified her husband's remains and then immediately went to pray. Reportedly, she expressed her gratitude to Heavenly Parent for being able to make such a wonderful offering for the sake of Tanzania.

When True Parents heard the news, Father instructed that memorial services be held for Mr. Sasamoto in nations all over the world. True Parents honored Masaki Sasamoto with the title, martyr. He was buried in the nation he served, whose people he had labored to give rebirth.
