Other presenters were Dr. Iparraguirre, District 3 Pastor for the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification (FFWPU), Tom McDevitt, Chairman of the Board of the Washington Times, Kaeleigh Moffitt, FFWPU Maryland Church Youth Pastor and John Redmond, the chief financial officer of Barrytown College of UTS. Presentations focused on providing relevant, practical tools for participants to actualize their professional dreams and

on how to direct one's professional life based on our core values.
