Programs

The Master of Arts in Religious Studies (M.A.) prepares students for diverse positions and ministries as well as for doctoral studies. It offers optional concentrations in Interfaith Peacebuilding, Non-Profit Leadership, Unification Studies and Theological Studies.

The Master of Religious Education (M.R.E.) prepares students for a variety of lay ministries, particularly educational ministries that emphasize sound principles of educational programming.

The Master of Divinity (M.Div.) prepares men and women for pastoral leadership.

The Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) develops ministerial leadership at an advanced level.

It is the authoritative resource for Unification scriptural and historical studies, based on the Judeo-Christian tradition, as well as ministerial training.

UTS continues its distance learning initiative this Fall with three fully online, for-credit courses.

ISLAM

According to statistics, Islam is the fastest growing religion in the 21st century making it the second largest world religion after Christianity. Why is Islam growing? How is Islam a challenge in the western world?

This course introduces the tradition of Islam from an authentic perspective, the life of Muhammad, the Qur'an, central beliefs and traditions, schools of jurisprudence, the history of Islam, the social impact of Islam, and Islam's theory of war and peace.

The course will also explore some of the contemporary issues related to Sharia (Islamic Law), Terrorism, Jihad, Human Rights and Women's Rights. 3 credits



Taught by **Dr. Darius Kone**, Adjunct Professor of Ministry (Peace and Justice). He also serves as UTS' Director of Student Life and minister to the Belvedere Family Community in Westchester, NY.

DIVINE PRINCIPLE IN DEPTH

Divine Principle provides the formula for our life with God and one another. It is also a resource for ecumenical relations, offering amazing insights into the Bible and Christian doctrines.

This is an advanced course equipping students with the analytical tools they need to deal with diverse opinions and faith styles. 3 credits



Taught by **Dr. Andrew Wilson**, Professor of Scriptural Studies at UTS. He has also worked as an author and an editor of World Scriptures, Chamizumo Gyeong, True Family Values, and Exposition of the Divine Principle

Online Course 5, 6 and 7

The courses are 8 weeks long. They began Monday, October 8, 2018 and finish Friday, December 7, 2018. The last day to apply is Friday, September 28, 2018.

UNIFICATION PHILOSOPHY

Unification Philosophy is the philosophy of Rev. Sun Myung Moon; this philosophy was then systematized by the late Dr. Sang Hun Lee as Unification Thought. The course explores various frameworks of interpretation in order to expand the meaning and horizon of Rev. Moon's philosophical ideas within and beyond Unification Thought. It focuses on articulating the philosophical principles in Rev. Moon's religious thought, explores their philosophical implications, and examines their plausibility. 3 credits



Taught by **Dr. Heisuke Noda**, Professor of Philosophy and Academic Dean at UTS. He is a philosopher with a background in phenomenology and hermeneutics.
