One mother gave us an insight of what she and her husband experienced to match their daughter, and later on their son. Another newly matched couple gave us a glimpse into the highs and lows of their matching process in order to be where they are now. They were all moving testimonies. And of course, John's testimonies throughout the lectures were eye-opening for many of us and truly made a difference. We are very grateful to all of those who volunteered their testimonies.



The next day, March 18, was a Matching Supporter Training. We had 11 brothers and sisters in total participate in the Matching Supporter Training. The content was eye-opening for many of us. Two of the participants had been Matching Supporters in the past, but for most of the participants, the content was
