Eito Suzuki Ordered to Pay 110,000 Yen in Damages by Tokyo District Court over "Hikikomori"-Comment

On 31st January 2025, the Tokyo District Court ruled in a lawsuit [See editor's note below] <u>filed by Toru Goto</u> (後藤徹), representative of the <u>National Association of</u>

Victims of Abduction, Confinement, and Forced Deconversion, against journalist Eito Suzuki (鈴木エイト). Goto sought a total of 11 million yen [\$ 71,100] in damages, claiming that Suzuki's remarks, including a comment referring to Goto as a "hikikomori" [social recluse - see editor's note below], damaged his reputation.

The court recognized two of the five statements in question as defamatory and ordered Suzuki to pay a total of 110,000 yen [\$ 711] in damages.

Although there was no planned distribution of courtroom admission tickets for this trial, the courtroom was packed, and many people who could not enter were seen in the hallway.

[Editor's note: According to the complaint, Suzuki criticized Goto on the news website Yaya Nikkan Cult Shimbun, where Suzuki is the main writer, as "a male believer who stayed in his flat and became a NEET [Not in Education, Employment, or Training] after recuperation, becoming just a 'recluse'."

On Nippon TV's Information Live Miyaneya, he repeatedly criticized Goto, such as commenting that he was a "recluse" (引き

[Editor's note: The Japanese term "hikikomori" (引きこもり) refers to people who completely withdraw from social life, often isolating themselves at home for extended periods - sometimes years. It describes both the phenomenon and the individuals affected by it.

Hikikomori typically avoid school, work, and social interactions, often due to anxiety, social pressure, or mental health struggles such as depression. The term is sometimes used in a derogatory way but is also recognized as a serious social issue in Japan and other countries.]



"Unthinkable Inhumane Methods"

Abduction, Confinement, and Forced Deconversion Panel Exhibition in Kurume, Fukuoka, Japan

A panel exhibition showcasing cases of abduction, confinement, and forced deconversion against former Unification Church (now Family Federation for World Peace and Unification) believers – described as "the worst human rights violation in postwar Japan" – was held on 26th and 27th January at the Kurume City Plaza in Kurume, Fukuoka Prefecture. Around 370 citizens attended the event.

A woman in her 30s, after hearing explanations about the realities of forced deconversion, expressed her outrage, stating,

> "The inhumane methods used by those carrying this out are simply unthinkable. They should be properly punished under the law."

Another woman in her 40s was visibly shaken, saying,

"I was truly shocked to learn that something like this was happening in Japan. It was

even more painful to realize that trusted family members and relatives were involved."

Interfaith Symposium on Religious Freedom

On 27th January, the same venue hosted the "Experts and Interfaith Forum", featuring a symposium on the role of religion and freedom of belief in modern society.

The session began with two victims of abduction and confinement sharing their personal experiences. This was followed by speeches from:

- Pastor Ryuichi Sunagawa (砂川竜一) of Tsukishiro Christian Church in Okinawa
- Chief Priest Ryoma Fukami (深見量真) of Kamo Shojoji Temple
- Shunsuke Uotani (魚谷俊輔), Secretary-General of UPF-Japan (Universal Peace Federation)

Speaking before about 30 attendees, including university professors and religious leaders from Konko-kyo [See editor's note below], the panelists addressed issues of religious persecution and freedom.

Pastor Sunagawa, deeply apologetic, said,

"I am truly sorry that Christian pastors have been involved in abduction and confinement. I sincerely apologize."

He then posed a question, "Why is the Family Federation being persecuted?" and shared his belief that

"God is preparing this organization, which loves both the nation and the family, for a greater purpose."

SecretaryGeneral Uotani
analyzed the current challenges facing the
Family Federation, which is facing a
dissolution request from the Japanese
government. Outlining future prospects for
the organization, he suggested a possible
breakthrough, stating,

[Editor's note: Konkō-kyō is a Japanese religious movement founded in 1859 by Bunjirō Kawate, a farmer from present-day Okayama Prefecture. It became part of the Association of Sectarian Shintō and is considered a forerunner of Japan's post-World War II "new religions." The faith centers on the deity Konkō (Golden light shines) and emphasizes a direct, personal relationship between humans and the divine.

A key belief in Konkō-kyō is the role of the *toritsugi* (mediator), a figure who intercedes between people and the deity, taking on their struggles and transmitting prayers. The position of mediator is hereditary, passed down through the founder's male descendants. The faith teaches that god and humans share a bond akin to that of a parent and child, promoting gratitude, sincerity, and harmonious living.

Konkō-kyō remains an active religious movement, with a significant following in Japan.]
