**Council Mission Statement (2015-2017)** ~ Our mission is to be a driving force for the community, and to support the Head Pastor, by establishing a clear organizational structure and thriving financial base, resulting in a vibrant, God-centered culture within our families and community.

## 2016-2017 Annual Budget Approval

This year it took many meetings of the Financial Committee, our Bookkeeper, Akiko Shields and the Council to come up with an annual budget we could approve. However, after much discussion and hard work, we have approved the Annual Budget! Though there are some financial challenges with our current expenses, there is a plan being developed to increase our income. A mid-year financial report will be provided to the community approximately February/March 2017.

# **Camp Sunrise Decision**

Despite last year's council's recommendations for debt prevention, due to reduced attendance and decreased income, Camp Sunrise this year has a debt of \$46,000. Because BFC sends the most youth to camp than any other neighboring church community, BFC is responsible for 40% of any debt. This year we need to pay \$18,000. As much as we all value Camp Sunrise, the community need s to make a decision about keeping the CS property or not. The council has stated to the CS board that we would only continue to support CS in 2017 if the community agrees to continue to support Camp Sunrise. For this reason we administered a community survey from 11/20 to 12/4.

## **Belvedere Property Rental Agreement**

At the November Council meeting, representing HSA-UWC Belvedere Properties Management, Mike McDevitt gave a report to the Council about plans for renting out the Belvedere Property to bring in income, and discussed how that would affect the Belvedere Family Church. We were encouraged hearing the good potential for more revenue by opening up our beautiful property for public use. This could begin this spring. A draft rental agreement between HSA-UWC and Belvedere Family Church for use of the Belvedere Property was presented, and we are moving forward with fine-tuning the agreement. Once it is finalized, we will let you know.
