ILC August 2021 - Session IV - The Potential and Benefits of Trade and Business Activities with North Korea



Foreign trade & business activities have always been a tool to communicate between different peoples, maintaining peace and providing benefits for both parties. Technology has increased these benefits by providing greater efficiency in the economy. How can it contribute to easing tensions on the Korean Peninsula? With North Korea's nuclear rise seen as a threat by neighboring nations, the UN sanctions currently block the country's trading capacity. However, at the recent 8th Party Congress, the country's leadership announced a new focus on economic development. China, Vietnam and other socialist countries engage actively in world trade. Could business with North Korea be interesting for both North Korea and the rest of the world? Does North Korea have the potential to become an attractive destination for tourism, for example from China, Russia, Japan and South Korea? Is it

possible to overcome the climate of distrust between North Korea and its democratic and capitalist neighbors? Which North Korean products and services can attract international interest? What are the obstacles to international business with North Korea? Can the resolutions of the January 2021 North Korean Party Congress boost business activities? What steps should be taken by both sides?

People's Common History and Culture Contribute to Peace on the Korean Peninsula?



Korean people share a long history. They survived repeated invasions by the Chinese, the Mongol and the Japanese empires. In 1919, the March 1st Independence Movement against Japanese colonial rule was a founding milestone for modern Korea. Moreover, the Korean people share a deeply rooted mythology, the legend of King Dangun, who is supposed to have established the Korean nation nearly five millennia ago. Both history and mythology have played their part in shaping an enduring Korean identity. After WWII, however, the political division imposed on Korea eventually settled into a confrontation of radically opposed ideologies, which still contribute to maintaining the conflict between North and South. Can the Korean people's common history and culture help forge a vision that transcends the ideological conflicts inherited from the Cold War and overcome the

division on the Peninsula? Click here to register.

ILC August 2021 - Session VII - The Role of the Media in contributing to Peace on the Korean Peninsula



Peace on the Korean peninsula is now as fragile as during the decades after the Korean War. South Korea is targeted in an ideological crossfire between powerful players due to its unique strategic position in Asia. Even in "peacetime", a war of conflicting narratives is raging, which are largely conveyed by the media. This raises vitally important questions regarding media ethics and press freedom, which is the prerequisite for mutual trust and understanding between people of different backgrounds. Therefore, the role of the media is equally vital in times of war and peace. Most importantly, the media can be a powerful aid in conflict resolution and peacemaking. This panel, consisting of media professionals from Korea, Europe, and the USA, will throw the spotlight on the role of the media in promoting peace on the Korean Peninsula.
