

## My International Itinerant Missionary Testimony in front of True Mother

They reacted by asking, When will this beautiful Cheonwon Project be completed?

One of the things I would emphasize at this point was that though it was not included in the video,

one of the most important things about all HJ Cheonwon Projects is the construction of the Cheonbowon. The Cheonbowon will be an archive to store records of the lives of Cheon Il Guk citizens. I told the members they are citizens of Cheon Il Guk, so they must go to Chung Pyung to see how many generations of ancestors they have blessed. They will want to go to see the Cheonbowon. When I told them that if they come in September they can see the building, they responded with a great cheer.

Because True Parents selected us, we were treated well as Cheon Il Guk international itinerant missionaries. We received praise, and could raise Mother's status. I have full faith that the Japanese members will continue to march forward toward 2020.
