Ms. Elizabeth Aihe, Chairwoman of the WFWP DC Chapter, shared, "There is hope for the future as we continue to collaborate with many organizations to offer services to our local community."

One elderly woman who stopped by the WFWP booth expressed deep appreciation, saying she felt a sense of belonging and wished to stay connected, as she often feels lonely at home. She was touched by the kindness of organizers and volunteers, who made her feel like family. Ms. Aihe exchanged contact information with her and encouraged her to call whenever she felt lonely or needed someone to talk to.All attendees received a bag of fruit and a bottle of water.
