The theme of our humanitarian visit was "Our Trust and Hope in Good and Bad times are in God our Heavenly Parents". This powerful, encouraging message was shared by WFWPSI Vice President, Mrs Mavis Namu. The message highlighted love and its importance about the types of love shared.

We handed out 40 gift packs to the children who smiled with joy as they received them. The gifts contained reading and colouring books, crayons, soap, cards, toys and hair pins and ribbons.
