Dr. Alicia Eleazar, a master's teacher and public school district supervisor with 11 years of experience at the Department of Education. She has a Master of Arts in English and a Ph.D. from the Global School of Ministry.

Dr. Angelika Selle, former President of WFWP USA. She is an editor of two magazines, a writer, theologian, and founder of the Interfaith Prayer Call and Transformative Vision Initiatives (TVI). She earned her doctorate degrees from My Life Theological University.

The program concluded with a "Peace Starts with Me" message, encouraging participants to examine their viewpoints, remain open-minded, and accept everyone's differences and uniqueness in the pursuit of equality and peace.
