In order to strengthen good inter-faith relations in the community, increase awareness of the different and distinct faith communities in the UK and to increase understanding between people of religious and non-religious belief, the Inter Faith Network for the UK has introduced national Interfaith Week. Watford Interfaith Association's contribution to this week is to organise an Interfaith Pilgrimage in Watford Town Centre, calling at 6 places of worship. The pilgrimage will spend 20 minutes in each place of worship and receive a bite-sized introduction to different faiths and their community. Starting at 12noon at the Watford & District Synagogue, the pilgrims will be welcomed with warm drinks and delicious kosher cakes before the Rabbi's presentation. We will then visit Watford Central Mosque and the Velmurugan Hindu Temple. This year for the first time we will be welcomed to the Al-Zahra Centre, Mosque and meeting place of the Watford Shia Muslim community. Afterwards we will go to Holy Rood Roman Catholic Church and our pilgrimage will end at the Gurdwara Sri Guru Singh Sabha, the Sikh Temple where refreshments will be served.

It is a free event and all are welcome to join this walk at any time. Women are asked to cover their legs with long skirts or trousers and bring some head covering for visiting the Hindu Temple, the Mosques and the Gurdwara. Shoes will also need to be removed at these places of worship.



- 1) **12noon - 1pm, Watford & District Synagogue**, Nascot Rd. As part of Mitzvah Day*, you are invited for tea, coffee and delicious kosher cakes before the Rabbi's presentation.
- 2) **1.30pm – 2pm, Watford Central Mosque**, Cambridge Rd. Shoes should be taken off and women need to cover their heads.
- 3) **2.15pm – 2.45pm, Watford Velmurugan Temple**, (Hindu Temple), Exchange Road. Shoes should be taken off.
- 4) **3.00 – 3.30pm, Al-Zahra Centre** (Shia Mosque), Fearnley St. Shoes should be taken off and women need to cover their heads.
- 5) **3.45 – 4.15pm, Holy Rood RC Church**, Market Street.
- 6) **4.30 – 5pm, Gurdwara Sri Guru Singh Sabha**, Ladys Close. Shoes should be taken off and both men and women need to cover their heads. Refreshments will be served.

*Mitzvah Day is the annual day in the Jewish community to engage in acts of kindness.
