While we move forward, it is important to reflect that it is 18 years since we received the sacred mission from True Parents to defend to the death the Leda area as it is "the protection place of God's Kingdom of Heaven." Over the years many have invested their heart and soul into fulfilling this special mission and have made a foundation for the current and anticipated advances.

Today at the Leda Settlement you can see the great advances made in agriculture, fish farming and in creating a model of sustainable development. To help secure the victory of the Leda providence, which is the final settlement of the ocean providence, we hope that you will give a maximum gift to Heaven from North America. In line with this, we are heartily asking for your cooperation. Let's make God's dwelling place, Leda, a land of hope for many people as we advance toward building a peaceful ideal world.
