This year reminded me just how vital it is when women unite to shape conflict prevention, peacebuilding, and education. A few moments stand out as I reflect on our journey:

In Brussels, our WFWP Europe & Middle East event, sponsored by Italian MEP Annalisa Corrado, brought together more than 90 participants. We welcomed MEPs, UN representatives, civil society actors, educators, and peace builders. The conversations affirmed that lasting peace rests on women's real participation in governance, decision making, education, and post conflict rebuilding. We moved beyond words to commitments, actions that advance equality, human rights, and gender sensitive peace strategies.

Our Tirana 22nd Annual Conference drew over 150 participants from more than 30 countries. The room hummed with voices from politicians, scientists, entrepreneurs, spiritual leaders, and activists. We explored values based leadership, education for peace, women's empowerment in technology, interfaith dialogue, environmental sustainability, and holistic well being. The “Bridge of Peace” ceremony stood as a powerful symbol of reconciliation and unity, echoing our shared hope for inclusive societies, sustainable development and genuine peace.

A connection to post conflict resilience, Mrs. Moriko Hori, International President of WFWPI, joined the 3rd Annual International Women, Peace, and Security Forum in Prishtina at the invitation of the President of Kosovo. Her presence highlighted resilience, forgiveness, and inclusive peacebuilding, underscoring that healing requires coordinated, multi-sector action. We also celebrated the vital work of WFWP volunteers who supported women and children through vocational training and education, solidarity among women as a cornerstone of lasting peace.

Beyond our flagship events, regional and national activities continued to flourish: educational programs, community resilience projects, interfaith dialogue, mutual support networks, and cross border exchanges that strengthened our shared fabric and amplified women's leadership and peacebuilding impact. I'm deeply grateful for everyone who participated, organised, and contributed.

To our donors and sponsors, thank you for your generosity and belief in our mission. Your support makes transformative programs possible for communities in need. To our volunteers, your hands on work, time, and energy bring our visions to life and inspire others to join the work of peace. 


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
