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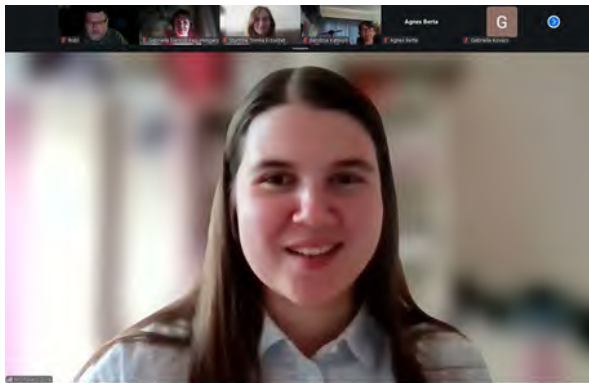

WFWP Italy - Presentation of the 29th Peace Award by the Rotary Club of Foggia to WFWP Italy



On May 16, 2026, a ceremony was held in Foggia at the Court Hall of the Provincial Palace to present the 29th Peace Award to WFWP (Women's Federation for World Peace) Italy, conferred by the Rotary Club of Foggia, District 2120.

Rotary Club President Antonio di Biase opened the event by explaining the reasons behind the club's decision to honor WFWP Italy. In his presentation, he highlighted the organization's guiding principles, its activities, and the extensive European and international network through which

it promotes peace, dialogue, and human development.

The ceremony continued with a presentation by Professor Carolina Ragone, a teacher at the Foscolo Gabelli Institute, who attended the event with 50 of her students. She spoke about the importance of peace education and the need to cultivate values of respect, responsibility, and coexistence from an early age through schools. WFWP Italy President Elisabetta Nistri then delivered the keynote address, presenting the organization's recent achievements and highlighting several important themes addressed through its conferences and initiatives. These included the challenges faced by women in countries where human rights are not fully respected, the significance of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security, and the inspiring examples of women she has personally encountered who are contributing to peacebuilding through their leadership and service.

Her speech was received with great attention and appreciation by the audience. The award presentation followed, featuring a sculpture symbolizing peace created by Master Silvano Pellegrini, together with a substantial donation in support of WFWP Italy's activities.

The event concluded with interviews conducted by local journalists, whose reports appeared in regional newspapers, and the production of a video reel by the Rotary Club documenting the occasion.

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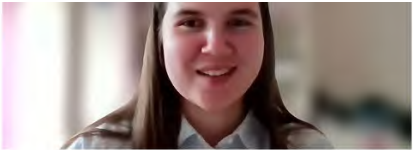

WFWP Ireland - EUME President Mitty Tohma Visit



Mitty Tohma, President of Women’s Federation for World Peace Europe & Middle East, conducted a three-day visit to Ireland aimed at encouraging local members and strengthening regional partnerships.

The visit began with an informal fish-and-chips supper, creating a warm and relaxed atmosphere where members could reconnect and share local priorities with regional leadership. The gathering provided an important opportunity for fellowship, dialogue, and encouragement.

A key highlight of the visit was the participation of four WFWP representatives at the Monaghan Peace Campus for the launch of *Imagine an Island*, a *Threads of Peace* creative writing project. The

initiative focuses on women’s lived experiences, exploring themes such as motherhood, borders, identity, and resilience. The project demonstrated how personal testimony and storytelling can become powerful tools for reconciliation and peacebuilding.

The delegation also visited the *Project Children* 50th anniversary exhibition, gaining insight into the long-term impact of sustained community engagement and peace-focused initiatives.

Throughout the visit, Mitty Tohma shared strategic examples and successful initiatives from across the Europe & Middle East region, encouraging Women’s Federation for World Peace Ireland to further expand its leadership and community-building activities.

The visit affirmed WFWP Ireland’s growing role as an important convener for dialogue, cooperation, and peacebuilding, while also identifying practical opportunities to deepen community impact through funded partnerships and trust-based creative facilitation.



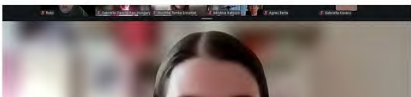
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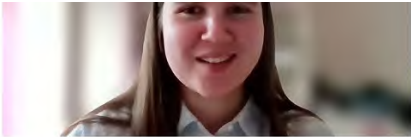

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WFWP Netherlands - Celebrating Family Values: WFWP and UPF Netherlands Mark the International Day of Families



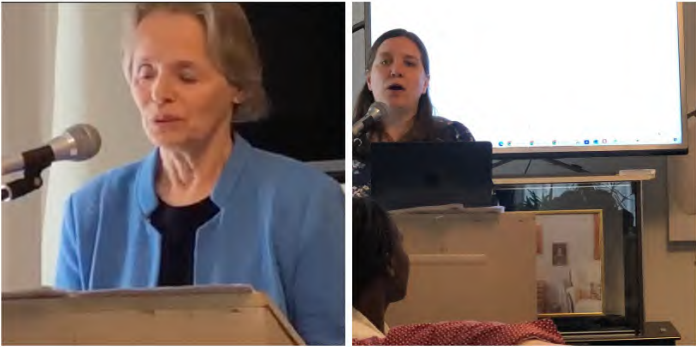
Together with UPF Netherlands, WFWP Netherlands hosted a dinner event to celebrate the United Nations International Day of Families. The gathering brought participants together for an evening of learning, reflection, and meaningful exchange on the importance of family in society.

The program featured two presentations. Margriet Noot, a former teacher and attachment specialist, emphasized the crucial role of strong family bonds in the healthy development of children. She explained that children thrive through secure attachment, loving guidance, and emotional safety,

while warning that modern society increasingly relies on professional systems to replace parental relationships, often weakening family connections. She stressed that strengthening families should be one of society's highest priorities.

She shared examples of WFWP initiatives that promote family values, peacebuilding, and community development around the world.

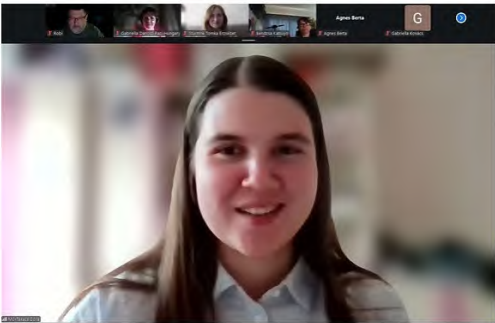

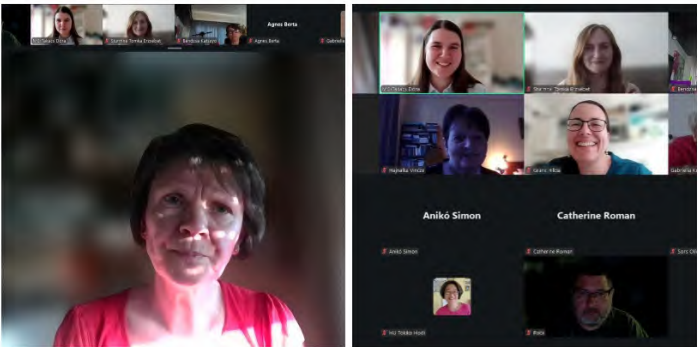

WFWP France - “Living together in Family and Society”



Paris Conference Highlights the Importance of Family Values for Peaceful Societies
On May 16, 2026, the Women’s Federation for World Peace (WFWP) and the Universal Peace Federation (UPF) organized a conference at Espace Barrault in Paris to celebrate the United Nations International Day of Families and the International Day of Living Together in Peace. Entitled “Living Together in Family and Society,” the event brought together a diverse audience and emphasized the vital role of family values in fostering peaceful, cohesive, and resilient societies.

Brigitte Wada, President of WFWP France, opened the conference by explaining the complementary significance of the two UN observances and their relevance to contemporary social challenges. Three speakers then explored the theme from social, philosophical, and cultural perspectives.

Christine Jouan-Bruneau, President of *Femmes de Demain*, addressed the challenges facing families in France today, including weakened family bonds, increasing youth violence, and the difficulties encountered by single-parent households. She stressed the importance of strengthening marriage and restoring parental authority as foundations for social stability.

Dr. Laurent Ladouce examined the philosophical foundations of altruism and social harmony, drawing on the ideas of thinkers such as Ernest Renan, Auguste Comte, Frédéric Le Play, and Martin Buber. He emphasized the essential role of filial, sibling, conjugal, and parental love in human development and in creating healthy communities.

Patrick Mangala, a journalist, offered insights into African family culture, highlighting solidarity, education, and cultural identity as key pillars of social cohesion and community life across the continent.

The conference concluded with a lively exchange of ideas on intercultural family values and their contribution to peaceful coexistence. The event also featured the presentation of Peace Ambassador certificates to three participants in recognition of their commitment to promoting peace and understanding within society.

WFWP Sweden- “Spirituality in Faith, Living in Peace” – An Evening of Dialogue and Peace



An interfaith gathering was held at Tensta Church on April 18 under the theme “*Spirituality in Faith, Living in Peace.*” The event explored how spirituality and maturity within different faith traditions can go beyond religious doctrine itself, opening pathways toward unity and peace. The gathering was co-sponsored by Universal Peace Federation Sweden and Women’s Federation for World Peace Sweden.

Welcoming remarks were given by Britta Houston, who also served as MC for the event. She reflected on the important role of women as peacebuilders during today’s turbulent times, mentioning a recent gathering in Rome where Palestinian and Jewish women marched together for peace despite their different religious and cultural backgrounds. She referred to the growing global movement known as “*Mothers Call,*” in which mothers and grandmothers are raising their voices together to demand peace, emphasizing that “there is no alternative.”

The song “*Lean on Me,*” performed by James Houston, created a warm and reflective atmosphere for the 57 participants attending the gathering. Later in the program, Sara Fuetsch moved the audience with another beautiful musical performance.

The main speaker was Levy Daugherty, an American pastor with over 50 years of ministry experience. He also led the audience in a group discussion where participants engaged in open and meaningful conversations. The event concluded with a moving song and a prayer circle, leaving participants with a strong sense of unity and hope. Overall, the atmosphere was uplifting and welcoming, highlighting the value of interfaith dialogue and cooperation in building peace.

Special thanks were extended to Karin Fuetsch and *Lyktans Vänner* (“Friends of the Lantern” book circle), whose support made it possible for the event to take place at Tensta Church.

The main presentation explored the theme, “*The Origin of Conflict and Suffering in Our World.*” In light of the many conflicts taking place globally at this time, participants related deeply to the topic. The presentation included quotations from a range of sacred scriptures, highlighting shared wisdom and values across faith traditions.

Following the presentation, Patricia invited several attendees to share their reflections and perspectives, including faith leaders and the voices of young women. Rev. Maureen Foxall then sang “*Make Me a Channel of Your Peace,*” followed by a period of quiet reflection during which we remembered all those suffering in the many troubled corners of our world.

The evening concluded with the sharing of delicious food and warm conversation, where new friendships were formed and old friendships renewed.

Overall, it was a wonderful evening of learning, reflection, and shared concern for peace, encouraging us all to continue our personal and collective efforts towards peace within ourselves, our families, our communities, and the wider world.

WFWP Albania - YOUTH ACADEMY FOR PEACE.



On Saturday, April 25, 2026, the Albanian Women’s Federation for World Peace hosted its flagship Youth Academy for Peace; This one-day training empowered 21 participants (aged 17–35) by focusing on ethical leadership, personal values, and social responsibility. The program featured two core sessions:

- Personal Growth as the Foundation of Leadership: Led by Katerina Minolari.
- Challenges in Relationships and Conflict Resolution: Led by Av. Dorina Prethi, a WFWP member and Deputy Chairperson of political party

A highlight of this year’s academy was the

collaboration with the Public Vocational Training Center No. 4, Tirana. Instructors presented professional course opportunities and start-up grants, leading a dynamic workshop where participants developed business project ideas to spark creativity and critical thinking. The Youth Academy for Peace” continues to be a vital space for fostering conscious, engaged citizens dedicated to peace and cooperation. Following this success, the Federation plans to expand the program to other cities, ensuring more young leaders have access to these transformative tools for personal and professional development.

Programme Highlights

- Community spirit: In a generous and spontaneous gesture, two new guests contributed additional snacks, fruits, and soft drinks.

The combination of sharing international work and fostering a family-friendly environment—especially with children dancing—created a vibrant and memorable experience.
