Today we held the commemorative service for True Father's Seonghwa.

The main hall of our Brussels-based UPF headquarters was filled to capacity with brothers and sisters, AfPs and friends who had come from all over Belgium and the north of France. Some members who we had not met for a long time turned up for the occasion. We were more than 50 people in total.



Messages of condolence sent by VIPs from all over the world were projected on the wall while participants took their seats.

We started the ceremony by singing 'Blessing of Glory', the future hymn of Cheon II Guk.

After Mr Philippe Jacques had made the opening prayer, passages from True Father's Peace Messages were read by Mr Aidan Cunningham.

A 16 minute video presentation was shown, covering True Father's life and achievements.

Reverend Chris Vonck, Dean of the Faculty of Comparative Religious Studies gave a beautiful and strong testimony about True Father and our movement, which he has known since 1981.
