Marlaina had dyslexia and never thought nor believed she was very smart. She was unsure about her value and always thought herself to be "weird." Marlaina was searching for a way out of the hell she lived in her life and read many books on psychology and on spiritual matters. Her first foray into spiritual reading was in high school when the class was assigned "Siddhartha" by Hermann Hesse. She wrote a book report on it which amazed her teacher, considering she was a poor student. Later, though she was raised a nominal Catholic, she read other books including those on the Wicca religion. But somehow the life she saw Robbie leading was a real inspiration. Eventually, she got Robbie to tell her about what kind of life she led and why. They had many deep and spirited conversations and Marlaina learned a lot.



One day, Robbie took her out to the parking lot and opened the trunk of her car and pulled out a small red book. "Are you sure you want this book?" she asked. "Because there is no going back once you read it."

When she saw we were an old couple around her age, she smiled and let us get on with our talk.

Marlaina joined our movement about 15 years ago. Aunt Ruth came for a one-day workshop and hasn't come back so far. Marlaina brought some friends and other family members to hear the Principle or for Sunday Service. No one has joined but we continue to hope. Unfortunately, Robbie also disappeared from our lives even though we tried to gently reach out to her.

Marlaina went to a therapist for over 10 years to get over the trauma in her life. She is working on her associate degree with an eye to help others deal with trauma as she has. A psychiatrist who tested her for an IEP (Individualized Education Program) said she was a genius. She never believed it when I told her, but she believed him! She has become a Reiki Master and is working on starting her own business. And she has related how God has put many mothers and fathers (including us!) into her life to help her learn how to relate to the idea of True Parents and Heavenly Parent. She is currently looking for a match so she can attend the Blessing. I must say that she has been a great blessing to me. I have learned so much from her and I have a friend I can talk to - sometimes for hours. My mother once said to me when she was in her 90s that all her friends had passed away.
