Cameroon Celebrates the Journey of Cameroon's 4th Batch of Youth Missionaries

On July 30th, 2023, Cameroon marked the conclusion of its fourth batch of missionaries' yearlong journey. The mission had embarked on August 1, 2022, with an intensive 40-day workshop tailored to equip the missionaries for the tasks ahead.

The training focused on several core components. They learned how to teach the Divine Principle (Divine Principle), handle various workshops, impart character education in schools, witness, and fundraise.

These elements became the backbone of their year-long mission. Notably, each missionary set personal objectives, including reading True Mother's memoir and True Father's autobiography three times each and the Divine Principle seven times. Furthermore, by the end of their mission, they aimed to have three spiritual children each.

The national leader welcomed esteemed guests to the closing ceremony: Sub-regional Director Rev Jean Pierre Kadima, the Regional YSP Secretary-General, Special Youth Envoy Sosheloba Houngbedji, and various youth leaders from the sub-region center. The Secretary-General emphasized that although the missionaries had completed their 365-day mission, their true challenge lay ahead; he urged them to strengthen their faith, especially as they step into university life, which will test their resolve and identity.

Expressing pride and admiration, the regional president lauded Cameroon's steadfast commitment to missionary training; and he shared that True Mother's dream was always for the second generation to take up the mantle of responsibility and fulfill her vision flawlessly.

The event was a joyous occasion for Cameroon. Families from near and far joined the celebration, connecting both virtually via Zoom and in person. The day's festivities culminated in a group photograph, symbolizing unity, commitment, and the shared hope for the future, with a turnout of 100 participants both online and on-site.
