2<sup>nd</sup> Nov

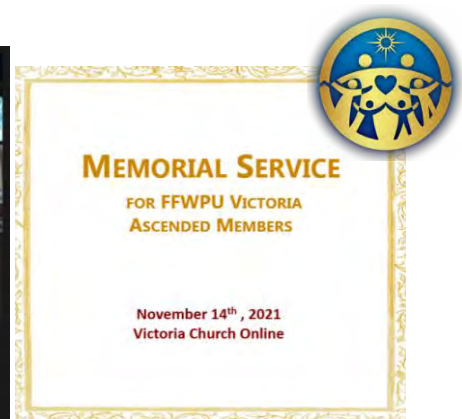

13<sup>th</sup> Nov

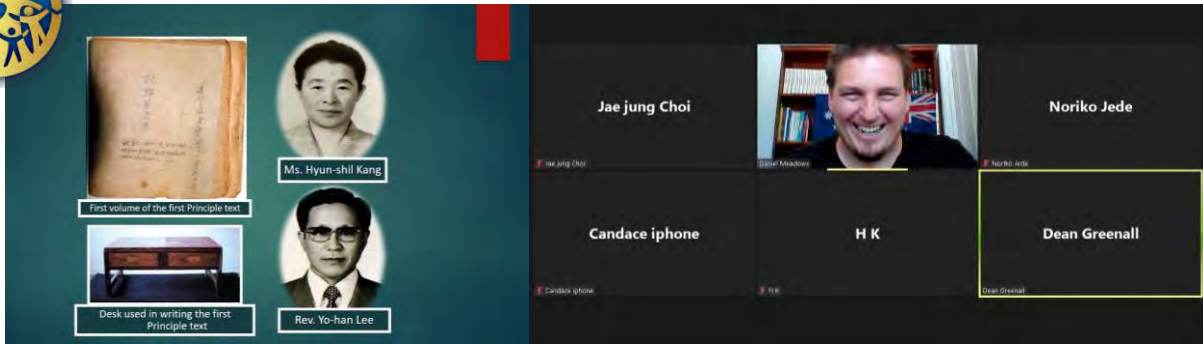

14<sup>th</sup> Nov

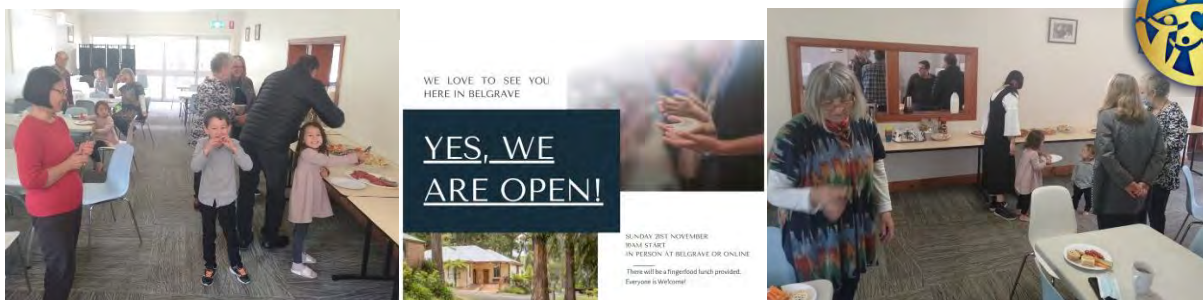

20<sup>th</sup> Nov

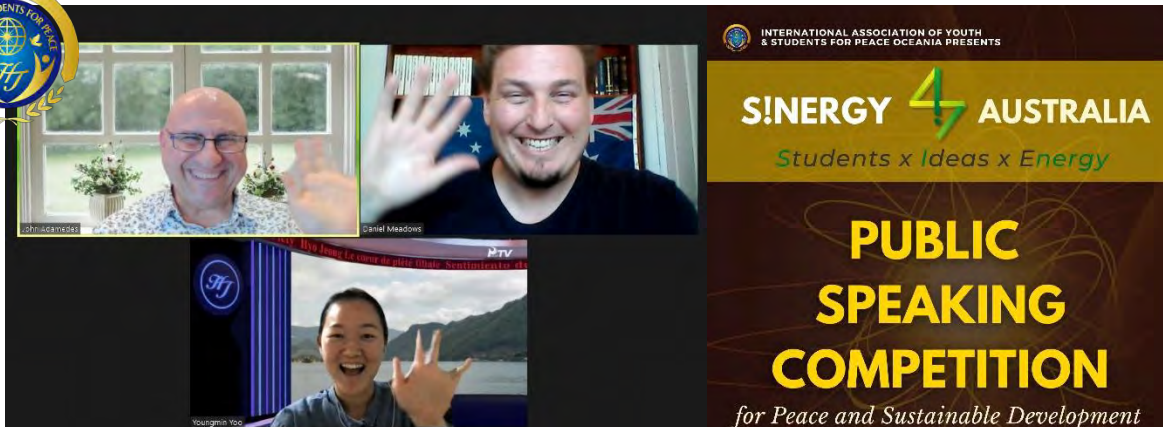

21<sup>st</sup> Nov

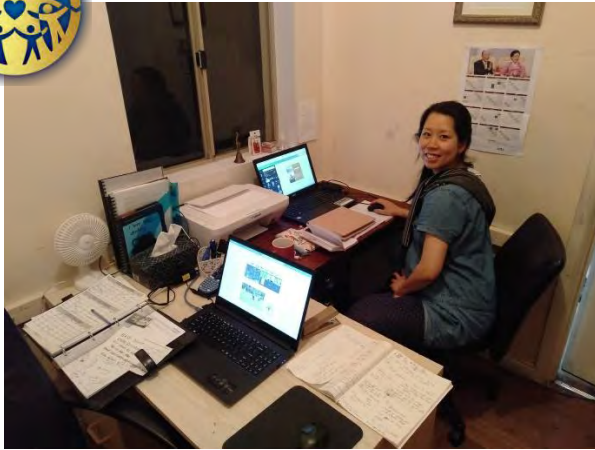

22<sup>nd</sup> Nov

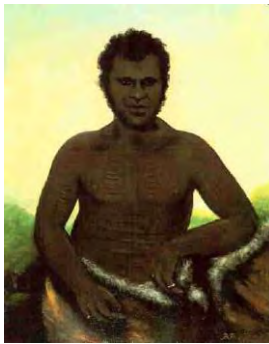

**Cheon Bo Report:**

27<sup>th</sup> Nov

At the Cheon Bo Heavenly Asia Pacific online event on November 27, seven notable leader couples were liberated who held key positions at the time of the settlement of Victoria and Australia by Europeans. They were Derrimut, aboriginal leader of the Boonwurrung people, William Lonsdale, the first colonial leader of Melbourne, George Augustus Robinson and William Thomas, Protectors of Aborigines in Victoria and Tasmania, Matthew Flinders, explorer, and three Presbyterian ministers: John Green, first manager of Coranderrk mission, Cheong Cheok Hong, missionary to the Chinese community in Victoria, and John Flynn, founder of the Australian Inland Mission and the Royal Flying Doctor Service. We trust they will join with other liberated Australians in working for the settlement of a Heavenly Victoria and Australia. Also liberated was Joseph Simon Gallieni a French soldier.
