

Jynene Helland sermon:

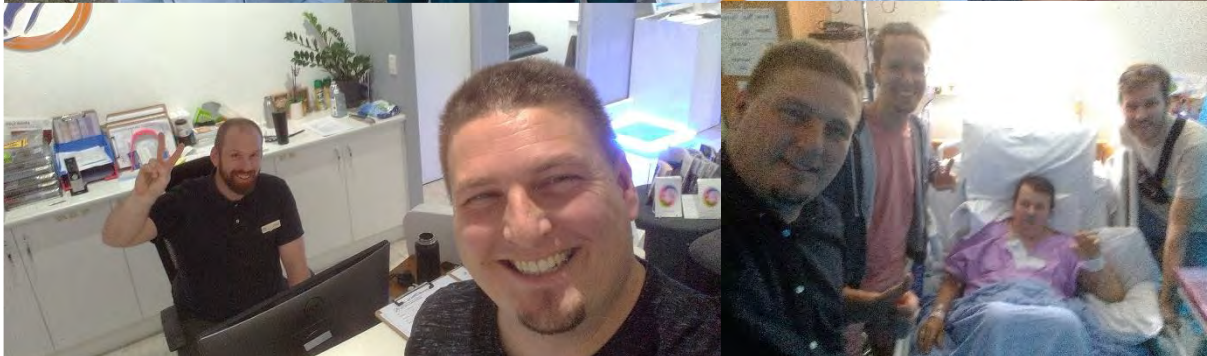
1st October
