Altogether, 5,000 Seonghwa students, 1,000 parents, 500 pastors and the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP) college students participated in this two-day, three night overnight cultural festival and camp. The CARP- and Universal Peace Academy staff members prepared 1,200 tents for the participants, who endured rainy weather.
