North Korea is a de facto nuclear weapons state. However, the U.S. has never accepted North Korea as a de jure nuclear weapons state, insisting that they denuclearize completely and verifiably. Kim Jong-Un's condition for another summit with President Trump is that the U.S. accept North Korea as a nuclear weapons state and cease any mention of North Korea abandoning its nuclear weapons program. Will the U.S. accept this condition for another summit?
