Job Description

The CARP Director will serve the UK student community – primarily of the FFWPU, which includes 2nd generation Unificationists – and coordinate the growth of this community through educational and evangelical activities.

This will involve:

- Organizing workshops that teach Divine Principle and raise leadership skills
- Being a central point of decision making and accountability for all CARP affairs
- Creating an environment where CARP members can further explore their life of faith
- Ensuring that the CARP Vision and Mission is carried out
- Empowering local communities to cultivate relationships amongst student and young adult members
- Maintaining a database of students connected to FFWPU and communicating to them regularly
- Coordinating student-focused worship services in the local communities
- Building a team of volunteers to support with the above tasks

Qualifications

- Right to work in the UK (essential)
- Exemplary standard of faith and character (essential)
- Good communication in English language, spoken and written (essential)
- Management skills; ability to work with a team (essential)
- Experience of teaching Divine Principle and speaking in public (preferable)
- Experience as a university student (preferable)

Details

The CARP Director would be expected to deliver at least 15 hours of work per week flexible in their own time, although they could use desk space in the FFWPU HQ in 43 Lancaster Gate. The salary will be negotiated depending on experience. The term of employment would be a twelve-month contract, renewable at the end of the contract. The CARP Director's line manager will be the National Director of FFWPU-UK.
