Groups of athletes are gradually arriving in Cambodia for the Southeast Asian Games (SEA GAME) to be held in May. The SEA GAME is called "Olympics of Southeast Asia", and shortly, 40 judges from Japan will be sent from Japan to evaluate the athletes' performances.
